# **Grounds Report**



March, 2021

A few updates regarding Grounds. The Smart Meter /Weather Station will be installed by the end of this month. The replacement of the sponges in the rain sensors will be installed at the time of the irrigation inspections at the end of March.

During the month of March (weather permitting) they keyholes in our areas will have leaves blown out and cleared. This should be completed by the end of March.

Some reminders for residents:

There are not to be any additional plantings in the front area of the villa landscape. Poinsettias are not allowed. Please remove any you have planted, and you may put them in your keyhole or along the carport. A slow process but we are attempting to recover any plantings / replace that are in areas that did not make growth as we had anticipated. This is an ongoing process.

Irrigation issues: thank you to those who have notified us regarding irrigation issues. However, a huge reminder...'PLEASE DO NOT ALLOW GUESTS OR VENDORS TO PARK ON THE LAWNS". We have had to mention this several times and there have been many broken sprinkler heads due to this problem.

As a few may be aware there was a weekend leak in the pump house however it was not due to irrigation. It however will increase our sewer and water costs as it ran until Craig discovered the reason at 7:30 am on Monday. A hose was left running in the pump house after pool company was here. We have the times noted and John Calia and I will make sure there will be a reimbursement of overage costs.

**Another major point.** IF you are using water to irrigate in back of your villa PLEASE do not overuse the time and water. This is increasing our consumption and it has been observed that several individuals are watering their back areas every day! Please adhere to 30 minutes once a week.

Reminders: Red Ribbons can be placed on plants you do not want to have trimmed.

Pick up of trimmings: DO NOT put your clippings out until **after 6 PM on Sunday night**. Not earlier. Blooming's will pick up on Mondays after 3PM. This is our way of keeping the community tidy rather than having the debris out all weekend. Thank you.

The Birthstone for April is the diamond that symbolizes innocence.




April flowers are the daisy and the sweet pea.





# **Building Committee Report**



We have been very busy identifying infrastructure issues. We decided to start on the Creek side units.

The main issue involves erosion. The erosion is causing a wash out of property that is affecting, keyholes, villa foundation issues, landscapes, existing patios and our seawall. Most of these issues are minor fixes but because there are so many of them the job will be extensive.

The cause of all of our issues is water. We can't control the rain but we do have some say so as how to direct it once it hits the ground.

I have asked Larry to confer with our attorney regarding requiring villa owners to install gutters around their units. Practically all of our issues stem from either no gutters, undersized gutters, broken gutters, clogged gutters and downspouts or downspouts pointed in the wrong direction.

Our issues go beyond what I have described to include tree issues including above ground roots. We are going to recommend numerous trees be removed. Villa owners may have a fondness for their trees but it is the entire community that pays for the upkeep and damage a large root creates.

As we move forward the community will be updated on our decisions and progress.

- Villa 125 is experiencing water/mold issues inside and outside their villa. The landscape slopes toward their unit and the villa next to them, 126, is approximately three feet above villa 125 with no gutter to reduce the amount of rainfall that flows toward V125. The gutters and downspouts on V125 are also adding to their problem due to size and pitch. My recommendation is V125 correct their gutter issues, V126 needs to add gutters and the area between units needs to be regraded to keep water away from V125 and be redirected to an open space.
- Flooding of keyholes has been a complaint I have been getting lately. In 50 years, our terrain has altered while trees have grown. Grass has been replaced by numerous applications of mulch and this has all created a problem. The interior of SRV will be the next area we dive into to identify issues.
- We cannot delay maintenance/infrastructure issues any longer. The longer they are put off the bigger the list gets and the more expensive projects become. We have been reactive instead of proactive. This mindset needs to stop.
- We have updated our modification forms. The new forms will make it easier for an owner to identify what is required by the Building Committee and also whether a modification form is even required. The new form will also make our job easier to identify whether all the proper information has been turned in. We have also created a form that is to be explained to and signed by new owners during the interview meeting. The signed form is then placed in their file.
- Our pool heater was repaired. The water should stay a constant temperature now. We did experience a problem recently where our pool technician turned some valves in the wrong position causing the pool temp to drop and about 5,000 gallons of water to go down the sewer. We will be reimbursed by our pool company for the water/sewer bill. We also need to replace a vacuum cap in the pool that will require the pool to be closed for a couple days. This cost will be \$1,000. I will get a few more estimates.

In the middle of the month, I sent out an email outlining plans for repurposing our landscaping debris storage area, building a kayak rack and launch area and wording for permitting new access into keyholes or the rear of certain units. These requests have been given to our new attorney and we are waiting for a response as to how we move forward.

I received quite a bit of positive feedback from the community and numerous requests to reserve a storage spot. Thank you for your encouragement.

Please keep in mind, raising Condominium Association dues is not our sole option to pay for overdue maintenance. We need to cut expenses and create new streams of revenue and be proactive.

As for Doris, she went to Marquette U. where she was blessed to meet her darling Jim at a mixer. She had a sweet boyfriend, so she didn't want to know Jim better. When she told him that she was looking for a 'guy' who would support six kids (a dream of hers), he left her in the middle of the dance floor...and she's not responsible for his coming back, is she?

Jim drove several of them home that evening and walked Doris to her door. He saw the construction site on the nearby hill and asked about it. When she told him our new church was being built, he said, "I'm going to marry you in that church someday." Doris was sure he was crazy!

They did just that, married, in 1952 and welcomed eight children to their arms. In 1969 while on a great family vacation, it was Doris' evening to lead grace. 


