On the lighter side..... HONEY



HONEY: Honey and cinnamon probably helps cure most diseases. It's produced in most of the countries of the world. It can even be used for diabetic patients.

Honey for the Heart: make a paste of honey and cinnamon powder, apply it on bread instead of jelly or jam and eat it regularly for breakfast. It reduces the cholesterol in the arteries.

Motion – To approve the Sales and Rental Report by Dan and seconded by Jean. Motion carried.



Grounds Report



April, 2021

There have been several residents asking about the types of plants they can install and what are our regulations regarding Grounds care. There are SRV Approved Shrubs for Keyhole, sides, back & Carport of villas. Residents **MAY NOT** add, change, or remove plants in the **FRONT** of villas. Plants that have not thrived in

fronts of the villas will be replaced by Blooming's without cost to SRV. A list of plants which are approved is available at the office. ***Any plants other than those listed on the approved list need prior approval by the Grounds committee, Complete and file a Work Order with the SRV Office.

Important Reminders Concerning Grounds

Realize the landscaping in Florida is different than "up north", both in selection of plants and in their care. If you are a "snowbird", you are here during our winter when plants are resting.

- 1. Landscape workers are supervised by Bloomings and SRV. Residents should not stop or interfere in their work. This just holds them up and slows the work for everyone. Issues should be taken to the office or Grounds Chairperson via work order.
- 2. Do not listen to or spread rumors concerning care of grounds. Talk to the Grounds Chairperson.
- 3. No planting should be done by residents on common Ground (see Section VII and VIII of Rules and Regulations). Common Ground is everything but your villa and carport (See Article IV of Declaration of Condominium).
- 4. With permission residents may plant along the sidewalk to the front door and the side and back of the villa.
- 5. You have more freedom to plant some flowers and small shrubs in your "keyhole" but please use common sense. Wires and pipes are located in this area and your villa mate needs to be considered. Attached is a list of approved shrubs.
- 6. Do not add any fertilizer or weed control. Some slight pruning of wayward branches is permitted and appreciated. This waste should be put in biodegradable bags, not plastic.
- 7. Plantings in front may not be changed, added or removed. Submit a work order for replacement of dead plants.
- 8. No ornaments are permitted outside the villa. (see rules and Regulations) If a member of Argus stops by to remind you, please thank him and comply.
- 9. Please read the Grounds Report in the News and Views each month for updates in procedures or policies.
- 10. Please allow at least 30 days for a work order to be completed after submitting to the office.
- 11. Thank you for your cooperation in making SRV a very pleasant place to live.

Building Committee Report



From your neighbors on the building committee. It's official, snow bird season is almost over. Many of our friends and neighbors are about to leave or have already gone north for the summer.

An email was recently sent out reminding everyone leaving to let our office know the details of your departure and return. This is very important.

Other important items are:

- 1. Make sure you turn your water off from outside your unit and turn off your hot water heater. Nobody wants to discover water flowing out of your home or for you to return to a moldy home. Make sure your water valve isn't leaking when you shut it off. If it leaks, please report it to the building committee.
- 2. Don't shut your AC off. Setting your AC at 80 will keep the humidity in your home at an acceptable level.
- 3. Either ask a neighbor, friend, relative or hired home watcher to make a minimum of a monthly visit to your home. They should turn your water on to flush your toilets and run water through your sinks. Toilet water will evaporate and roaches will come through your drains if the trap under your sinks don't have water in them. They should also check that your AC is working. They should check to make sure your windows and doors are locked and also look for any water marks in a ceiling. You don't want to return to a roof leak. Pick up any mail that might have been delivered. Don't forget to have your home watcher turn the water off before they leave.
- 4. Please remove all your personal items from around the outside of your villa. Grills, chairs, garbage containers, pots or wall hangings can become projectiles in a storm.
- 5. If you are going to have any work done in your unit while you are gone, please let us know. This is important for everyone's security and peace of mind.

If you have a neighbor that has already left, please take a look around their unit, if anything has been left outside, please inform our office.

As a reminder to everyone, if you have turned in a modification form and your project is about to start, please keep the building committee updated.

SPOTLIGHT: BILL HILSON

Life with Bill Hilson

A life of travels and adventures

Bill was born at home on Dec 13, 1927 in Bronson, FL extending the family of 2 brothers and 1 sister; later to become 3 brothers and 2 sisters. His father was a publisher of 5 weekly newspapers, which he managed so successfully, that he was offered a job on the Hickory, N.C newspaper. This paper was much larger, so in 1933 the family moved and Bill attended Hickory Elementary School.

His father became ill in 1937 and during some of this time, he and his older brother lived with his Aunt for one summer. Unfortunately, his father passed in 1939. Typical of the times, when his mother tried to collect the life insurance, she was only given a small amount of the proceeds. Life became difficult, but the family came together to make everything work. Bill did his part by singing and delivering telegrams for Western Union from 5 through 13 years of age. In high school, Bill played football and became part of the track team. During his high school years Bill had moved to a High School in Miami, FL from which he graduated in 1944.

After graduation, with World War II going on, he tried to convince his mother to sign a release for him to join the service at age 16. She refused, so he waited until he was 17 years old and joined the Navy; he served in the Pacific on an aircraft carrier. He remained in the Reserves for 6 months after the war and while attending the University of Miami he met his future wife and they were married in 1947. The marriage produced two sons; the first son was actually born on his father's birthday. The second son was born 6 years later. During this time he went to work for Eastern Airlines in Miami. Bill started as a stock clerk and worked his way up to General Foreman of Maintenance. He retired in 1983

The taste for travel was in Bill, so he decided to try family camping starting with a tent and then a popup and then joining The Holiday Ramblers. They graduated to an Airstream Model 1976. They joined Wally Byum (WBCCI) caravans. As time went on Bill promised his grandchild that at age 10, a trip anywhere they wanted to go, which would lead the 3 of them to many new and wonderful travels. Bill and his wife enjoyed many adventures while traveling through Europe on Euro rail trains until his wife's passing in 2002.


In 2003 at an Airstream rally at Robarts Arena, he was introduced to Orvella McGrath, a fellow traveller and SRV resident. This led to new travel adventures throughout the United States and river cruises throughout Europe; along with a new active social life at SRV.

Bill's been an avid Bird Watcher and fishing has become a great pastime, right out his back door. He even caught a 44 inch long snook in the Phillippi River. Bill still plays poker and says "he's holding his own". He also plays golf and shuffleboard. He recently won the highest score for one game during the Shuffleboard Tournament. He had 2 eights & 2 sevens. He enjoys starting plants from pineapple tops and tending to his




